SECRETARY'S REPORT

We have now completed our 2nd full year as a unified club but there remains quite a deal of administrative "work in progress" to be completed and fine-tuning to improve the way we manage, implement and allocate Committee activities and responsibilities.

In combining the various reports that make up this, our 20th Annual Report, it's noticeable just how many members, individually and collectively contribute time and energy to managing and running the Bowls Section – The Committee is most appreciative and grateful to you all. However, this year our endeavour to persuade members to join one of various sub committee's and/or the Committee has failed with seemingly not one "new face" stepping up to the plate. We are fortunate, indeed that the majority of members of the various subcommittee's, have agreed to continue for another year. However, key positions of Secretary and Greens Director remain unfilled, with, additionally likely to be two Committee positions, vacant. Succession, per se, will challenge the new Committee during the year ahead.

A shining success, again this has been VSC's e-News, which is now distributed to 86% of our bowls members, up a whopping 10% from last year (76%). With just a "click of the mouse", eNews which is is edited, produced and published by John Temple enables the majority of our members to be regularly informed about club events, results, news and "happenings" etc,. Thanks John, your flair for the job and skilled production; is appreciated. Thanks also to our diligent news "hounds", Gail Pearson, Neil Cameron and Michael Keel.

Membership has grown over the past year from 241 to 256 including 7 pending COM approval. The recent special promotion via Try Bowls (4 in Feb) resulted in Nine (11) "recruits" who are now being coached and close to being "passed to play". We also have one "Transfer" pending. Membership growth is healthy and trending in the right direction and, according to Bowls Australia CDO, Paul Holtschke, "Vermont South" is in top ten of 61 clubs in his region, that are actually growing – i.e. leaving 84% (of 61) with declining membership!

Over the past year, the club has connected, really well with our community, by hosting events for school children, local businesses, clubs, and special needs groups, one such event was on display recently, when we welcomed 61 special needs students' from eight Eastern Special Development, schools, for a "Gala Day" organised by Bowls Victoria.

The Committee, decided at their last meeting (Mar 14), to divide the existing combined "Sec/CCO" role into two discrete, interrelated jobs - CCO (Chief communications officer) and Secretary with the latter responsible for **Intra**-club (internal) activities and CCO dealing with all external communications including receipt, distribution and response to **inter**-club, flyers/correspondence and communication with Bowls Victoria and the Region (ERBR). The position of Secretary remains unfilled but I have agreed to stand for re-election on understanding that, if elected, I'll take-on both the CCO and Secretary roles, for the year ahead, ONLY!

In closing this report, I'd like to acknowledge and thank; Chairman David, Asst. Sec Gail Pearson, the Committee and my other collaborators: VSC Sec Jim Baker, VSC Membership Sec., Paul Dunn, webmaster John Temple, for their support and encouragement.

Finally, on behalf of all members, I'd like to convey a special vote of thanks to Val Weight, for her care of those among us who have been/are unwell or unable to play bowls. We are most grateful for your ongoing, sensitive commitment to the wellbeing of others and together with your, always up to date, progress reports – they are appreciated, too! Derek Mullett assists Val, as needed and, thank you too, Derek!

This year we achieved an overall profit of \$57,570 i.e. 3% lower than the previous year despite a 3.8%, increased in income, due mainly to inclement weather in December and wet weather together with excessive heat in Jan/Feb causing a number of Pennant and Social Bowls games to be cancelled. Having access to only one green, during the installation of the new green in the first two months of our winter programme, also had an impact on the profit downturn

Overall costs were up 17.5%, on last year, due mainly to work on the surrounds, facilities and gardens of the new green. Taking this into account we believe the overall result is very satisfactory.

FACILITIES PORTFOLIO REPORT

The Facilities Portfolio has been easy to manage due to the enthusiastic and generous members who give their time so freely and willingly.

GREENS

I have pleasure in presenting this; my final report as Greens Director, to the members of the Vermont South Bowling Club, outlining some of our activities for the year and providing information regarding the completion of the reconstruction of the East Green and forward planning for this year and beyond.

The Greens Committee comprises of; Noel, John, Tony and Ian Bennett and of course our longest serving member Ron Vogele who despite on many occasions suffering from chronic pain is always there to lend a hand, repair equipment and give advice, also to our new comers Jim Cull, Denis Quintel and Keith Horlock. as well as our co-opted painter Stewart Andrew who has done an outstanding job of painting the whole of the exterior of the Clubhouse, Workshop as well as the Greens Office, seats and shelters.

The Greens Committee members spend hours preparing the greens twice a week from 7.30am to 10.00am Monday and Friday mornings from early September to end of March and once a week for the remainder of the year. As well we check the greens every Saturday and Tuesday morning to make sure all debris is removed from the greens prior to pennant and that the green speeds are within the guidelines as laid down by Bowls Victoria. Without doubt this club is most fortunate to have such a team of willing, knowledgeable and dedicated Greens Committee members. I extend my thanks to each one of you for a job well done.

Our three goals again this year, which were set at the start of the season, were;

- 1. To achieve a green speed of less than 17 seconds for all pennant games.
- 2. Obtain the highest possible rating for the annual Greens Inspection.
- 3. To maintain the greens to the best of our ability and provide members with the best possible playing surfaces.

These three goals were achieved with both Greens rated an "A" the highest level possible and our new East green rated as the best synthetic green in the Eastern Ranges Region.

Other important regular maintenance projects were;

- Watering and regular grooming to reduce green speeds.
- Regular poisoning and spraying to remove algae from the surface of both greens
- Modification of greens usage to reduce wear on both greens at different times of the year.
- Painting lines on greens.
- Regular trimming of trees and shrubs to limit overshadowing.
- Cleaning ditches, banks and surrounds
- Repairs to shelters and drinks fountains, removing rubbish and garden maintenance

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GREENS (CONT)

The highlight this year was the commissioning of the East Green and for me personally to be invited to roll the first bowl, for the opening of the season, it was a great thrill. The Green was finally handed over to us in late August as KCL was responsible for providing on call support and advice for the first 3 months after physical completion. Minor repairs were carried out by KCL at this time and since then all work has been undertaken by us. The surface is reacting as predicted, slower on a hot day and slightly faster on a cold day and in the evening, the draw on both hands is very predictable, the closest possible to a natural grass surface.

The West Green was opened in 2008 and is showing signs of wear after having such heavy use for the last four years and requires a lot of effort to maintain at a sub 17 second speed for pennant. As members are aware this green was rolled back twice in the first 15 months due to defects in the base, which has caused the carpet to stretch and depressions are also evident along the line of an old drain. We will attempt some sub-base repairs during this coming season and may need to undertake regular heavy grooming to improve the longer term playability of the green. I suggest that replacement maybe required earlier than first thought, which needs to be planned for now, not only a budget figure but also a review of most appropriate surface.

Congratulations to Noel Bennett who has been appointed as a Greens Inspector for the Eastern Ranges Region and thanks to Christine Holland who our link with the Bowls Sect., Committee.

MARKETING and PR REPORT

Two years ago, when I was previously in this role, I wrote that *the best "marketing" comes from the advocacy of current members*, and I stand by that observation. I extend my thanks to every one of you who have promoted the club in both formal and informal ways. Your friendly greetings to visitors, your sportsmanship on the green, your support of new members, your positive comments about the club to your family and friends, all contribute to "marketing" and our club's brand.

During the summer month's we have had well in excess of 200 visitors to the club through our **Corporate Bowls initiative**. We have made a clear profit of \$3,229 without including the substantial boost to bar takings. We still have 3 events to run, at the time of writing this report. I have had many enquiries that could not be accommodated, due to dates being unavailable. Interestingly, the majority of enquiries have resulted from visits to our website, and most groups have been new, not repeat visitors, this season.

The feedback from Corporate Bowls activities continued to be very positive;

- We have enjoyed the involvement of the members on the green. They have been positive, encouraging, very helpful and extremely welcoming
- ▶ It is great to have the venue for our sole use (other clubs with a far more mercenary focus, pack in several groups at a time and there is no personal connection to speak of)
- The Club is superbly maintained and evident from the buildings and the surrounds, that member's take pride in the place and it is clearly treated with great respect.
- We are planning to come back to do some team-building
- ► The food was great.

We have used Barefoot Bowls to build better links with the Tennis section by running an event for tennis members prior to Christmas.

Livingstone Primary School students will be undertaking Lawn Bowls as part of an extension PE program, this being a result of connections made with the school staff who attended our club for their Christmas function.

Not only have these events promoted our bowls club, they have generated extra funds and made important links with the **community, prospective bowlers and sponsors**.

None of these events would have happened without the assistance of members and, In particular, I wish to acknowledge the work of Allan Lamb, Alex Blundell, Geoff Parry, Jim Cull and Wyn McNamara, who have been part of the on-green leadership team. I extend thanks to everyone who has helped to make these events successful and fun.

You will read a separate report about **Try Bowls** which is also a key part of club promotion, along with other initiatives which have gained publicity for the club, including the recent highly successful bowls day for students with Special Needs.

Neil Cameron is to be commended for his tireless work in the **Sponsorship** area. We were extremely pleased to be able to work with VSC to gather our sponsors together in November to acknowledge their valuable support.

Communication within our Club, as with all Clubs, continues to be a challenge. I am pleased to report that the eNews is now bedded down as a central communications plank for the club. I wish to extend heartfelt thanks to Gail Pearson for putting the Bowls news together each week, the many members who have provided articles for publication, and John Temple who has supported the eNews distribution.

You will also be aware that Sponsors are promoted on the TV screen in the Clubhouse, as are the weekly pennant results. Thanks to the members who take time to prepare this data.

I urge all members to make a point of reading the various notices on display in the Clubhouse. Communication is a two way street, and whilst every endeavour is made to publicise activities, notify members of various issues and celebrate successes, there is an expectation that members take personal responsibility to be informed.

Our **handbook** is another valuable source of communication. Michael Summers and Laurice Webb have been central players in the preparation of the Handbook. We thank them both for their commitment and time.

In a digital age, we must continue to look at the ways we connect with both our own members and the public, especially sponsors and prospective visitors and members. To that end, VSC is looking to revamp the website and input from Bowlers, will be welcomed. It is interesting to see how many more of our bowls members now check teams on the website and use email as a preferred way of communicating. As we recruit younger members, there will be an increased reliance on digital information, and as a Bowls Club we need to respond to these demands. This is an aspect of club development being promoted and supported, by Bowls Victoria.

Thank you to all who have worked tirelessly to promote the club. You can be truly proud of your efforts.
