## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to present the 2012/13 Annual Report to members for their approval.

Well what an exciting year of progress and change it has proved to be! We have had changes in Section Leaderships, a rebuilding of the Tennis Committee, a new Tennis Coach, a complete upgrade of the East Bowling Green and the renewal of the sprinkler systems on all Tennis Courts.

Firstly I must mention the East Green replacement. With the loss of an expected government grant, the project put quite a lot of pressure on our budget. I must commend our Treasurer Phil Staley on his work providing the Committee of Management with well researched and accurate alternatives to funding the works. It was decided to not just replace the Green, which had to be done, but to do the surrounds at the same time to avoid damaging the green later. Andrew Ross was appointed Project Manager, and he and his helpers have done a superb job delivering a fantastic final result on time, on budget.

As we are all well aware, our Tennis Coach of 32 years - Ian Strong - decided to concentrate on golf, football (barracking) and travel. Ian already knows how we feel about his contribution to the club, so we wish him well and offer our thanks.

In January our new coach Jessica O'Meara began coaching and we hope she has a long and enjoyable association with the V.S.C. Our membership has remained static but we are hopeful Tennis numbers may grow slightly as there seems to be renewed interest locally. More recruiting drives for all sections will be scheduled for late in the year.

Finances are in a healthy position considering what has been achieved this year. Obviously knowing that replacements and upgrades are inevitable is an advantage and I commend previous Committees for continually putting aside funds for these projects. We will have to keep doing this while also improving what we have.

Our Sponsorship this year has been strong thanks to Gary Simmons and Neil Cameron. Sponsors have become an extremely important part of our finances so we thank them and implore our members to use sponsors services whenever possible.

Finally I must thank all members of all committees for their time and effort

during the year. Speaking to someone about our club recently, I remarked that we have about 240 Bowlers and I reckoned 180 of them are on a committee or work group of some sort. I wasn't joking; we are that sort of Club. I am hoping soon we will have the same commitment from all our sections.

To the Committee of Management, great work everyone. Phil Staley I have mentioned already, he has been superb. Unfortunately Phil is not seeking reappointment to our committee; we will miss him, thanks Phil. I wrote last year Secretary Jim Baker's work rate is scary, nothing has changed. I found out how much he does when he went on his travels. Gary Simmons says he's slowing down, but he still organises uniforms, helps sponsorship and knows where everything is. Mal Walker worked on several Sub Committees during the year and is always available. John Temple, my mentor, keeps me from falling behind with my chores, is a great sounding board and has done a fantastic job with the newsletter. Ian Bauer keeps hinting that he will step aside if I want him to. Why would I; he has great experience and is stable influence when we get ahead of ourselves.

Special thanks again to Jock Halley, Bar Manager Extraordinaire. Jock's work behind the Bar coupled with the time he spends purchasing stock and stacking and sorting is a huge commitment.

To all other volunteers and members thank you for your continued good work, enjoy your sport and friendships with our club and have safe and happy 2013/14



## Coaching

We offer a Hot Shots Program for ages 4yrs+ which use modified equipment/balls and smaller court sizes which the young players have really taken to which allows little champions to emerge. We also have launched Cardio tennis on Wed & Thurs nights 7-8pm which has given a different look towards tennis and attracted some new clients that want to work up a sweat, get fit, have fun and sometimes groove to the music while hitting. In Term 2 we started the 90min & 120min Advanced Squad program which is invitational by coaches, we currently run junior squad and senior squad programs for the athletes who want a more serious focus to tennis. We still run group lessons for all standards and of course the Wednesday morning Ladies group which has been great fun. All players have now taken to the new programs and have gotten used to some new assistant coaches faces. Our regular coaches are Richard Korvas, Luke Bratchford, Joseph Sanchez, Corey Jackson and Manning Davison. We have also had Lloyd Iaccarino, Anastasia Sarantis, Jasmina Behlic and Elliott Lawson help us this year but are currently perusing other focuses with either study or career paths and we wish them all the best and thank them for all their wonderful efforts. It's an exciting time at Vermont South Club with new programs and holiday clinics. We will be launching along with Tennis Australia/Tennis Victoria the new shortened orange ball hot shots under 10 competitions for players that are almost ready for district comp, along with getting recognised as an ACE club which will run programs for Vermont South Special School in early 2014 as well as a mums and bubs group. It has been a wonderful year and we are looking to continue to grow and develop the programs offered.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Once again we had a successful year financially. The surplus for the 2012/13 financial year was \$39,799, compared with \$37,242 the previous year, an increase of \$2,057.

There were increases in Membership income, Corporate Events and Venue Hire, and Bank Interest. However, Playing Fees (primarily Tennis) collected declined compared with last year. On the expense side there was significant saving on Interest charges and Clubhouse Maintenance but more was spent on Utilities and Tennis Court Maintenance (mainly due to watering system overhaul).

The major project for the year was the East Bowling Green Upgrade, this included replacement of the surface, concreting of the surrounds and a significant overhaul of the sprinkler system. The total cost of the project was \$214,385, which we were able to fund without borrowings or government grants. This has set the club up well for future development and upgrade of facilities.

Cash on hand at 30<sup>th</sup> June 2013 is \$54,772, down just \$157,207 on last year despite the East Green Project.

The Club remains in a sound financial position with the strong prospect of increasing its financial strength into the future. We look forward to the members' continued support to maintain our club's reputation as one of the premier sporting facilities in the City of Whitehorse.

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## Financial Statements as at 30 June 2013

Notes to the Financial Statements.

- Statement of significant accounting policies.
  - 1.1 Basis of preparation.

The financial report is a general purpose financial that has been prepared in accordance with Associations Incorporation Act 1981, as amended, and the applicable Australian Accounting Standards required by Schedule 1 of that Act for prescribed associations. The financial report has been prepared on the basis of going concern and historical cost conventions. The accounting policies are generally consistent with those of the previous period except where detailed otherwise in these notes.

#### 1.2 Inventories.

Inventories are recorded at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Cost is based on the first –in first-out cost method and includes expenditure in acquiring the stock and bringing them to the existing condition and location. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of the normal selling pattern.

### 1.3 Property, Plant and Equipment.

Items of property, plant and equipment including buildings and other leasehold property are recorded at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is applied on a straight line basis over the estimated useful life of the assets.
