ANNUAL REPORTS (FOLLOW)

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CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

It has been my privilege to lead this wonderful Club for the last twelve months. Past leaders and administrators have built a strong and robust organisation which makes it so much easier to take over the reins. In addition, I have had the benefit of working with a fabulous team of dedicated volunteers, throughout the entire Club, who fully understand their responsibilities and perform diligently with a minimum of fuss.

Most Bowling Clubs are struggling with declining membership numbers. We are too, but not to the same extent. Every year we see an increased number of retirements so we have to replace each and every one just to break even. Recruitment of new members has been disappointing this year but recent efforts with a Try Bowls campaign looks very promising and we may match last year's total. We need to keep working hard on recruitment.

Our Saturday pennant sides delivered mixed results. Our first side (Div 2) was the only one to make it to finals and then lost in the semi-final. Our second side (also Div 2) were very unlucky to miss-out on finals due only, to shot difference. Nevertheless, they had an excellent season. All other sides finished mid ladder and no side was relegated.

All year, selectors were faced with more available players than positions in teams. This was mainly because Bowls Vic cancelled competitions in which we had entered teams. To ease the problem, we introduced a rotation policy in our lower sides to share the games missed regardless of the players' skill and performance level. On top of that, our 6thside found itself in a competition where several sides withdrew making a mockery of the competition. However, consistent lobbying by Allan Lamb and Keith Horlock forced Bowls Vic to revise their fixture to avoid multiple byes and to provide regular games for our players.

We fielded eight sides in Midweek Pennant this season with four sides making finals. This was an excellent result for the season. Congratulations to our top Open side (Div 1) which won their Section Flag. Congratulations also, to our fourth Open side, that lost their Section Final but gained promotion to Div 2 next season. Unfortunately, 2 sides will be relegated. Interest in Midweek Pennant has never been higher!

Of the eight midweek sides we fielded, one was for Women Only and the remainder were Open. We want to continue offering Women Only bowls but we are very much in the hands of Bowls Vic and other Clubs where there seems to be a lack of support for this category.

Our Pennant selectors have worked under added difficulties this year with excess players and the Club rotation policy but have performed their duties well, always with the best interest of the Club and individuals in mind. Their work in ensuring games for our sixth side was admirable.

We entered only one side in Night Pennant this year. Our side performed quite well containing a mix of experienced and novice players. We hope that we might return to two sides next season.

The Tournament Committee, chaired by Mal Walker, actively promoted and conducted Club Championship tournaments. Our Singles Champions are Gwen Goodwin and Ken Barnhill. Congratulations to all of our new Champions in all events.

Our Gala Day and the Pro-Shot Tournament again went off brilliantly thanks to excellent organisation by the Tournament Committee especially Val Weight and Gary Simmons.

Congratulations to Lorraine Bennett and Rick Carver for their success in Regional and State level, Novice Tournaments. Both won Regional titles with Lorraine also winning her way into the State Final which will played in April and we all wish Lorraine well.

Social Bowls continues to be popular with members and visitors. Open Pairs on Mondays during Winter and Mixed Social on Thursdays all year round are the best attended events. However, some of our programmed events do not attract the numbers they deserve so we may need to rejuvenate or modify. One of the reasons is the outstanding success of midweek Pennant which has taken away many players from Tuesday Nights and Wednesdays in particular. Our convenors do a great job week-in week-out and we much appreciate their efforts.

An important Committee initiative this year was a full review of our Club. We knew we had a very good Club but we wanted to explore how we could improve and transform us into a *great* Club. Clive Wilson ably led this review that involved discussions and feedback from many members and, also other Clubs. The Development Review findings will be presented to members at the AGM and, with lots of follow-up action, the Club can rise to a new level.

Andrew Ross has merged our Greens Committee into a close-knit, knowledgeable and hard-working team who enjoy what they do. As a result, we have two of the best synthetic greens in Melbourne. Well done Andrew and the greens team.

Our Gardens have been beautifully maintained by Vivienne Bennett with additional help from members via regular working bees. We can be proud of our gardens which look terrific. Similarly John Molloy and Stewart Andrew quietly undertake general maintenance tasks to keep our club facilities in tip-top condition - all without fuss or fanfare.

As usual, our Social Committee delivered a social calendar of terrific functions and also raised significant funds for the club. I am pleased that the popular end-of-season trip has been reinstated with a new destination. Well done Norman Weight and your Committee.

Our catering teams provide excellent support to other areas of the Club particularly the Tournament and Social Committees. Their tasty meals are always enjoyed.

Rob Sharpe stepped into the role of Corporate Bowls convenor and, with solid support from many other members, has delivered a magnificent outcome. We appreciate everyone's effort in this area which not only raises significant revenue but also creates exposure for our Club.

All members of the Bowls Committee contributed wonderfully this past year with enthusiasm and dedication. I must make particular mention of Keith Horlock, Chris Holland and Clive Wilson who performed their roles with aplomb and provided great support to me.

The fibre of our Club is based upon volunteerism. We get good support from the bulk of members but many do more than their fair share. Without that support we could not survive. We want to spread the load so I would ask that you get involved, however you can, to help our Club keep running. There is no doubt that those who become involved create closer and deeper friendships across a wider cross-section of our membership base.

I sincerely thank all Committee members and all volunteers for their enthusiastic service to the Club and I appreciate your support over the past year. Finally, I thank my wife Julie for her backing, patience and understanding. I look forward to a successful year ahead for the Club.

At Bowls Vic and Region level, we were represented by Region Volunteer of the Year, Andrew Ross (BV Greens) and ERBR committees, by Andrew Ross and Noel Bennett (Greens), Ed Benetti (Men's side selector) and Mary Farley and Keith Horlock (Championship committee).

We were privileged to host several ERBR / State Championships over the summer season and chosen by Bowls Victoria to host, a Saturday Metro Pennant Section Final. Of note too is the successful running in August, of a practice session and practice game, against a club side, for the State Arm Bowlers squad, exceptionally well organised our end, by Alan Lamb

Our membership remains steady, thanks mainly to the recent, significant "Intake" of new members, brought about by a targeted recruitment drive and subsequent Try Bowls sessions and the exceptional level of "sign-up's" during March has enabled us hold membership at about 250. An impressive result especially as most bowls clubs are experiencing decline in membership!

VSC's e-News, edited, produced and published by John Temple, continues to be a wonderful means of communicating news and information to members. eNews is now distributed to about 85% of our bowls membership (including new members) Unfortunately, about 15% of members, miss-out on eNews and the new CCO is hoping to develop a simple means of enabling these members to access this informative resource! Thanks John for your unswerving dedication to the task of producing a motivating, weekly edition of eNews! Thanks also to our "resident" Bowls Section Reporter Gail Pearson and other occasional and regular contributors.

I am not seeking re-election but I will be assisting the new Secretary, off Committee as I've offered to be club CCO that is, the first point of electronic contact for Bowls Vic, ERBR, other Regions and clubs in the Region, receiving and disseminating information on a "need to know", basis.

In closing, I wish to acknowledge and thank the Committee and others including VSC Sec Jim Baker, VSC Membership Sec Paul Dunn, Handbook coordinator Michael Summers and Webmaster John Temple for their support. My special thanks also to Val Weight, for her sensitive care of bereaved members and of those among us, unwell or unable to play bowls.

TREASURERS REPORT

A summary report showing RECEIPTS and PAYMENTS for the Bowls Sect of the Vermont South Club, is attached, for the Bowls FINANCIAL YEAR Apr 1, 2015 to Mar 31, 2016. Points of interest:

- 1. The revenue for the year increased by \$17809 excluding the Echuca/Moama trip but we also had an increase in expenses of \$12865. Prizes \$6071, catering \$2732, general maintenance \$765 and club promotions \$1355 were the areas of increased expenses.
- 2. The special prize draws run by Wyn McNamara and Michael Keel resulted in \$2800 profit
- 3. The Free Member draw resulted in \$500 being won by 5 club members over a 4 month period.

The Vermont South Bowls Club is very fortunate to have a willing group of volunteers to carry out these functions and to ensure we remain an exciting club for our members.

These results may be viewed in contrasting manner by members - from a competitive viewpoint pleasingly all sides have maintained their position within their division for next season following two sides being relegated last season.

Unfortunately however, no sides were able to gain promotion or win their section. Saturday selectors, whilst content from the no relegation aspect, were disappointed that once again our 1st side lost out in a semifinal.

The Saturday Selection panel would once again like to thank "Emergencies" who made themselves available when needed. The number of players "un-available" each week ranged from 6 to 17, making consistency of selection difficult and causing the Committee approved "Rotation" Policy to be implemented on some occasions.

Attendance at Thursday practice sessions remains a concern from a team competitive viewpoint. The increase in members participating in Tuesday pennant has understandably impacted Tuesday p.m. pennant practice.

Selectors would like to thank TMs Peverelle, Oxley, Deegan, Smith, l'Anson, BJ Brown, J Baker, and Haines for their dedication in carrying out their weekly Side Manager role for their respective sides. Sides cannot operate without them.

The selectors must give great credit to Keith Horlock for his tenacity in lobbying Bowls Vic and other clubs to have our Div. 7 side's program redrawn. After the withdrawal of three sides, the season would have been 11 games at best. The important thing was to provide an avenue for a competitive game for our side on a weekly basis which Keith was able to negotiate.

<u>Night Pennant</u>: (Mal Walker – Side Mgr). This season, we combined new bowlers and experienced bowlers in each team. There were many successes but unfortunately we fell away slightly over the last 3 rounds. The two bowl triple event and early finish proved popular and a good way to experience pennant or to play a second competitive game each week. Hopefully, next season two night pennant sides may be a possibility.

Coaching (Geoff Bryant – Coordinator) - Over the past 12 months our accredited coaches have been busy with activities that continued right throughout the year.

Coming into the 2015 winter, under the guidance of Lloyd laccarino, a squad was formed to fast track development of promising newer bowlers in preparation for the pennant season. Despite the cold and sometimes wet, 14 winter night training sessions were held when Lloyd gave participants benefit of his experience gained under top performing coaches at his high level of bowls competition. Squad members showed the benefit of this training throughout the pennant season.

Congratulations to Lorraine Bennett and Rick Carver who entered the ERBR Novices Championships. Both have much natural talent and work on their games with enthusiasm and commitment. Lorraine has now won her way into the State Novices Championship Final and we wish her all the very best.

Immediately prior to commencement of the 2015/16 pennant season, together with the Selectors Committee, we ran a Skips Training night. In panel format this session was well attended and provided a good learning opportunity for new and potential Skips. Also included was a segment on measuring. Our thanks go to panelists; Allan Lamb, John Temple, and Gary Simmons, and to Gwen Baker for her contribution on measuring.

The Monday morning pennant season, Skills Training sessions were well attended. Each session was structured to provide for bowlers of all levels to work on the various shots of the game. With coaches overseeing the sessions many bowlers also received individual coaching to help improve their delivery and shot making confidence.

Our coaches have enjoyed the opportunity to assist bowlers of all standards. The number of bowlers requesting one on one coaching grows and we welcome and encourage this. My sincere thanks go to coaches Andrei Butskikh, Jim Baker, Jim Cull, Lloyd Iaccarino, David Perry, Pat Russell, Gary Simmons and Lachlan White for their support and assistance over the year.

<u>Tournament Report</u> (Mal Walker Director): In the past 12 months the 9 member Tournament Committee has been active in coordinating social and open bowls events, club championships and special tournament events for our Club.

Both Gary Simmons (Pro-shot Tournament) and Val Weight (Gala Day) must be congratulated for their dedication and commitment in coordinating and running their respected event which not only places our great Club on the map but also returns good income.
