PRESIDENTS REPORT

Winter is well and truly here and hopefully now we will get the steady rains that are long overdue. The cold and wet weather makes outdoor sport a little less comfortable and as a result participation drops off. This is further accentuated by the many members who are able to head north to chase the sun and warmer weather. Nevertheless our Club has scheduled a busy program of tennis and bowls events so we will continue to see plenty of activity around the place right throughout winter.

Membership Fees

Good news for all members. After analysing the Club's financial position and with consideration to the current economic climate, we have decided to keep membership fees at current rates. There will be no rise in Club Membership fees this year. However, bowls and tennis affiliation fees have risen slightly so you will see a small increase in the total amount you have to pay.

Member Survey

Every member should have received a Membership Survey Form with their recent membership renewal notice. This survey will improve our understanding of our members' needs and help us in the planning of facilities, events and services. Your responses will influence the future direction of our Club so please give due consideration to the survey questions and return the completed form no later than 31st July – but the earlier the better.

Future Leaders Program

At the end of June, we are sponsoring three of our junior tennis players to attend a 3 day residential training camp run by Tennis Victoria. It will focus on development of leadership skills, coaching and sports administration. We were thrilled that all of our nominations (Tess Giannaros, Lloyd Iaccarino and Richard Kovacs) were accepted by Tennis Victoria and hope that they benefit from the training and most importantly, enjoy the experience.

Online membership payments

Whilst we are looking at offering credit card and online payment facilities for easy payment of membership fees, we need to ensure that implementation and transaction costs are reasonable and that our systems are capable of handling the process without significant extra workload on our volunteers. Unfortunately, we have not been able to do this at this time so we regret that we cannot offer this service for this years membership fees.

With the experience gained from this event, we will be well placed to run many more tournaments in the future.


Tennis Administration



A full report on our trip will be in the next newsletter, hopefully with pictures. Perhaps we will even post it all on our new club website. Um maybe not.


Remember it you are a VSC member you are already eligible to become a dartie, no forms, no nominations, just come along on Thursday, a warm welcome awaits you.


