PRESIDENTS REPORT

Water Saving

The installation of our water recycling systems has now been completed. We now collect water from the roof of the lower clubhouse and from both bowling greens. We store the water in two steel tanks with a total capacity of 150,000 litres. From the tanks, the water can then be pumped to all tennis courts and to automatic sprinkler systems on both bowling greens. A good proportion of the water used on the greens will find it's way back to the tanks again.

This project was completed with the assistance of a \$50,000 government grant and an investment by the Club of nearly \$19,000. Although it is very difficult to estimate, we believe we will save a mega litre of mains water per year. But, more importantly, we have provided a way to protect the Club and keep it running should more drastic water restrictions be imposed.

Thanks to the many members who worked on this project with special mentions to Kevin Donovan and Gary Simmons. Kevin did the initial research followed by a detailed report to the VSC Committee of Management. Gary did the legwork to secure the grant.

Website

We are in the process of developing a new Club website which will allow much better and more immediate communication with members. We expect that it will also help the Club to save on printing/mailing costs, recruit new members and generate additional sponsorship through increased community exposure. Any member without internet access will continue to receive newsletters in the mail, so no-one will be disadvantaged. Tennis Administration

The tennis section is comprised of several fairly independent groups such as mid-week ladies, night tennis, week-end comp, juniors and social players. Each group is generally well managed by relevant committees or convenors but they operate on their own without much contact with the other groups. Unfortunately, this means there is no overall cohesion and a lack of forward planning by the Tennis Section as a whole

Our Tennis Chairperson, Flick Nolan, has been trying to rectify this situation for some time now but is getting only limited support from within. It's time for a change. We need members to step up and take on some responsibility. We've heard all the excuses about busy workload, study commitments etcetera, but frankly we believe most of those excuses are just an easy way to avoid responsibility. For the most part, the Club is looking for a contribution of just a few hours per month – a small amount of time which I'm sure most people could easily find.

Flick and I will be meeting with all groups within the Club during this month to seek your support. Please, please give this serious consideration as the future of the Tennis Section is at stake. If this lack of involvement continues our clubhouse and court facilities will deteriorate, there will be fewer organised tennis competitions and opportunities for a game will be diminished. We can't let that happen.

I am disappointed to report that in the early hours of Saturday 28-Feb the Club was burgled. The thieves cut through the perimeter fence, damaged our new clubhouse and stole liquor and cash. Although insured, we will suffer a financial loss. We are taking immediate steps to deter future break-ins.

TENNIS COACHING

The junior coaching continues to be popular and the start of the year has been very busy with 39 **new pupils** enrolling for Term 1. There are still some times available for ladies coaching which is conducted on Wednesday or Friday mornings.

COACHING TIP

To get the best performance from your tennis racquet the strings need to be replaced every 12 months. Strings even when not being used stretch and the loss of tension can effect performance.

COURT MAINTENANCE

The tennis courts have been treated with magnesium chloride which assists with water retention during this time of drought. For this product to work and to maintain our courts the courts **MUST** be watered for at least 8 minutes before you commence play.

This allows the water to penetrate - a light sprinkle is not enough. If you give the court a thorough soaking it will remain damp for at least and hour and the playing surface and the bounce with be more even.
