PRESIDENTS REPORT

The cold and gloomy winter days are gone and summer is upon us so we can now enjoy the outdoor activities at our great Club in bright and warm conditions. I really hope all members take maximum advantage of the events and resources available to them at our Club over the summer months. There's nothing better than playing bowls or tennis on a balmy summer night.

You may be interested to know that, over the last 8 months, the VSC Committee of Management has been compiling a wish list of projects and capital investments that will either improve our facilities or assist in the running of the Club. The list is comprehensive and despite a desire to do them all, the Club simply cannot afford to. So we prioritised our requirements and we have settled on the following projects as the first in line to be implemented.

Project	Time frame
Provide recycled tank water (hose & sprinkler) to net line of tennis courts	Dec 2009
Install drip irrigation system in garden beds surrounding West Green (tank water)	Dec 2009
Replace lamps in tennis court floodlights	Jan 2010
Install piped natural gas BBQ on paved area adjacent to West Green	Feb 2010
Refurbish male & female toilets in Upper Clubhouse	May-Jul 2010

In addition, we anticipate that we will have to replace the East Green within a 3-5 year timeframe. As you might expect, this will be at a significant cost in excess of \$200,000 so we are already working on our financial strategies including how we can obtain Government assistance for the project. We are also allocating funds to an Asset Replacement Account.

Everyone will be aware the Government is tightening liquor licensing laws as a response to alcohol-fueled violence in the community. We are not immune to this and we have been warned to expect close scrutiny from Dept of Justice inspectors. Penalties for indiscretions are severe and potentially crippling to a Club like ours. We have

sought advice from various sources and as a result we will be putting in place a range of measures to protect the Club and our members. Some of the new rules may not be popular but it is important that we comply or we can be heavily fined and/or lose our license.

I was very pleased to present **Clive Wilson** with Life Membership at the AGM in September as he has contributed immensely to our Club. Clive was Club President for a record equalling seven terms during which time he used his management and leadership skills to steer the club away from a fragile financial position into a position of strength and stability. He played a key role in the planning and delivery of the new bowling green and the magnificent clubhouse redevelopment.

Over 140 members responded to our Membership Survey conducted last July. We were able to get valuable feedback and excellent suggestions regarding a wide range of issues. In general, the survey confirmed that members are very satisfied with most aspects of the Club. Of course we are following up those areas that our members say need to be improved or adjusted. Survey results can be downloaded from our website.

I continue to be impressed with the enthusiasm and creativity shown by three of our junior tennis members after their attendance at the Future Leaders Camp last June. **Tess Giannaros, Richard Kovaks,** and **Lloyd Iaccarino**, have worked together to organise many successful events including Club Championship tournaments, a junior sleep-over and a bowls night. They tell me they have bigger and better plans for next year.

A very successful Corporate Bowls day was held at the Club in November. Hewlett Packard hired our facilities and thoroughly enjoyed their bowls experience even with rain interruptions. Hopefully this is the forerunner of many more similar events. Although a minor inconvenience to members, these events add to our income streams and provide recruiting opportunities so there are benefits. Thanks to the members who offered their time to make the day a success and in particular to **Geoff Bryant** for the overall organisation.

NEW LIQUOR LICENSING RULES

Due to new laws that will be strictly policed by Government inspectors, we must insist that the following rules be followed without fail. Non-compliance could result in severe penalties which could cripple our Club e.g. fines, increased fees or cancellation of our liquor license.

“Red-line” area.

Alcohol may only be consumed within this area which encompasses:

inside both clubhouses,
upper clubhouse verandah and
lower clubhouse deck area.

There are diagrams showing the red-line boundaries displayed in both Clubhouses. Under no circumstances should alcoholic drinks be consumed outside of the designated area.

Trading hours

Alcoholic drinks can only be sold &/or consumed on Club premises within the following trading hours:

Mon – Fri	11:30am to 11:30pm
Sat	11:30am to midnight
Sun	12 noon to 10:00pm

Drinks cannot be sold after the times shown BUT patrons are allowed a further 30 minutes to consume drinks previously purchased. No drinking is allowed on the deck area of the lower clubhouse after 8pm on any night. Trading is not permitted on Good Friday or Christmas Day or before 12 noon on Anzac Day.

Visitors must sign-in

All guests to the Club must sign one of our visitors books which are located at the front door of the lower Clubhouse and in the upper Clubhouse.

The only exceptions are visiting competitors, parents of junior players and hall-hire guests.

Responsible serving

The Club follows responsible serving of alcohol principles meaning we will not sell or serve alcoholic drinks to any person suspected of being intoxicated.

Take-away

Packaged drinks purchased for take-away must not be consumed on Club grounds, in the car-park or adjacent parkland.

We thank you for your understanding and co-operation on this very important issue.

OUTDOOR BOWLS

The pennant season is now half way through and at this time we have 4 sides in the RVBA Saturday competition on top of the ladder with the other two sides sitting in 7th and 8th spot. The VLBA Tuesday competition after ten games has VSC sides in 9th, 7th, 5th and 2nd spot.

The results reflect the depth of the Club, in recruiting, encouraging and promoting new bowlers to take up the sport and in providing them with an excellent base to develop their skills thanks to the great work of our coaches and experienced bowlers. This season it is the lower sides that are performing extremely well against their opponents, winning games at home and away on both grass and artificial surfaces. The top sides are under pressure each week with very strong competition from the likes of Glen-Eira - Mc Kinnon, Richmond Union, Coatesville and Clayton making life tough at the top.

This year we could have 6 out of 10 sides playing in the finals. It is imperative that we keep up the great work and continue with the training regime that was instituted prior to the start of the season. An improvement of only 5% - 10%...(3 to 5 bowls per person per game) would mean wins for Vermont South, that's how close the margin is between winning and losing.

Tuesday night pennant is underway with some early wins recorded and the Saturday Ladies are also performing well particularly the Division 2 Side with 6 wins and sitting in 3rd spot.

Other highlights include;

*Bowls night for the Tennis players organised by the Junior Tennis section leaders (Lloyd, Tess and Richard) a great success with about 25 tennis players learning the basics of bowls, enjoying a sausage sizzle and then coming out and playing a game of bowls.. Some potential members out of this lot particularly the mid week ladies.....and Lloyd's mum.

*Hewlett Packard had a social bowls afternoon at the club 60+ staff attended, 15 of our members assisted to make this a most successful venture into Corporate bowls. Very hot afternoon 38+ degrees, meant the bar also had a good work out particularly the Crown Larger. Well done to all particularly Geoff Bryant through his persistence the day came to fruition.

*The success of the new Wednesday 2 Bowl Triples Competition is fantastic

with the game open to all members to join in. Some surprising performances have been recorded with the prize money being spread around and no team dominating the competition. The last day before the Christmas break 16th December is “White Pants and Bright Shirt Day” a prize will be given for the best dressed team courtesy of Russell Covell and some other prizes given out. The members of Vermont South Club have voted overwhelmingly in the affirmative for unification. The working party reviewing the Club Rules and Constitution has met on three occasions and currently are reviewing the format of the New Board and job descriptions for Board Members. If the unification vote is carried on December 3rd, we will be provided with a draft copy of a Club Constitution by Bowls Victoria which will assist us in finalising our draft copy.

*Thanks to our Wednesday Morning volunteers who look after the disabled bowlers who come each week. Your efforts are greatly appreciated by each and every one of them. The careers have told us on numerous occasions that coming to bowls is the highlight of the week for most of their charges. The support, good humor and encouragement given by our volunteers is wonderful to see and be part of. Thank you for supporting this aspect of our club.

*We also record here our thanks to Ross Borden for the great work and service he has given so generously to this Club over the last 14 years as a member of the Greens Committee and most particularly the last 9 years as Greens Director. Ross is stepping down at the end of December and looks forward to “grooming” the new Greens Director into shape. Thanks from all of us Ross a great job well done. Watch this space for the Positions Vacant Notice, all candidates will be interviewed by 236 members.




