SECRETARY'S REPORT

We have now completed our 3rd full year as a unified club and the secretarial administrative routine, processes and procedures are established and settled in to "steady as she goes" status!

In combining the various reports that make up this, our 21st Report, reminds me again of just how many members, individually and collectively contribute time and energy to managing and running the Bowls Section – The Committee is most appreciative and grateful to you all. Unlike last year our endeavour to persuade members to join one of various sub committee's and/or the Committee has been successful because we have received a nomination for all vacant Committee positions

VSC's e-News, edited, produced and published by John Temple, continues to be a great means of communicating news and information to members. eNews is distributed to about 83% of our bowls membership (approx. 250), which is down a little from last year (86%). Unfortunately, a substantial number of members, without email access (roughly 40) miss-out on eNews and an item on the Committee's "to do" list is to develop a simple efficient means of enabling these members to access this wonderful resource. Thanks John for your ongoing dedication to the task of producing an interesting, informative, weekly edition of eNews! Thanks also to our "resident" Bowls Section Reporter Gail Pearson and other occasional and regular contributors.

Our membership remains health at about 250 – 90 Women and 160 men. With 26 new members (M15 men and W11) joining over the past year and we remain one of just a few clubs in the State where membership continues to hold steady. (Bowls Aust CDO, Paul Holtschke)

We continue to connect well with our community, by hosting events for schoolchildren, local businesses, clubs via Barefoot Corporate Bowls activities and special needs groups. We have also worked closely and assisted Eastern Ranges Bowls Region over the summer season by successfully hosting a number of Regional Championship events and over the next few months we are hosting, on behalf of Bowls Victoria, a Coaches training course (April 18/19) and a training day for the Victorian under 18 Squads (20th June)

The way we administer club business has changed but significantly, it's the rapid change that's taken place over the last year or so, that's had an impact on club secretaries throughout the State as the paperless electronic way of doing things pushes it's incessant way forward generating challenges and the need to reorganise (*some say creating an illusion of progress!*). A major aspect of this change has be the introduction by Bowls Victoria of the "Bowls Connect Online Database" which each club is expected to maintain. With about 20 editable box's per member (approx 250), has resulted in the need to check/cross-check with our own database, about 5000 pieces of information and I am most grateful to Wendy O'Brien for her assiduous help with this tedious task!

In closing this report, I'd like to acknowledge and thank the Committee and my other collaborators: VSC Sec Jim Baker, VSC Membership Sec., Paul Dunn, webmaster John Temple, Wendy O'Brian for their support and encouragement. My special thanks also to Val Weight, for her understanding and sensitive care of those among us who have been/are unwell or unable to play bowls.

TREASURERS REPORT

Please Refer to the attached etailed report (last page) for the 2014-15 club year. It is pleasing to note an increase in revenue of \$15,451 derived from the following areas;

٠	The 2 tournaments run by Gary Simmons & his team	\$5097

The balance of \$3959 derived from an increase (over previous year) in Green fee revenue.

Expenses increased by less than \$1400 resulting in an overall **increase** in net revenue of \$14,080 and the Committee would like to thank everyone involved with this outstanding result, achieved by a lot of hard work and dedication.

The Saturday pennant selection panel would like to acknowledge the support of members who acted as "emergencies" throughout the season and we are pleased to report that each week we were able to field six complete teams of 16 players. The number of "outs" each week continues to be a concern for the competiveness of all six sides. This impacts all teams, but particularly sides playing in lower Divisions. Not all members understand the impact absences have on all teams. Fortunately, early concerns about rotation did not become a reality due to unavailability numbers.

We would also like to thank those who acted as team managers for each of the six teams. Without these people our teams could not function appropriately. Hopefully, next season will see new volunteers for these positions.

Developing bowling standards across all sides continues to concern of selectors. Dwindling member interest in the pre-season and regular, team practice are also concerns to be addressed.

Midweek Pennant (Chair: Ronda Benetti)

We had a positive season and finished with 4 sides playing finals, a rewarding result! The other 3 sides were very competitive in their divisions. The Division 4 Side won the section and flag and will be promoted to Division 3 next season which will give us sides in all divisions.

The new voting slips, enabled bowlers to self-access their performance, have provided added information for selectors.

Ronda and Allan, thank all members of both selection panels for their support and time throughout the season. They are also very appreciative of the duty teams and members who remembered their afternoon tea and lunch duties as these tasks contribute to the smooth running of both days.

<u>Night Pennant</u> (Mal Walker) had a great finish to the season in winning the last six matches including two games away against Box Hill RSL and Heathmont BC. The side finished third and it was pleasing that during the season all home matches were winners.

Coaching (Geoff Bryant. Coordinator)

With a new coordinator and many new coaches, the coaching panel have worked hard and created a strong presence this season.

Monday skills sessions had good attendances each week with enthusiastic participation and focused manner. A planned program of drills to help everybody improve their game under the guidance of accredited coaches was provided. All bowlers, whether they were pennant, social, experienced, inexperienced, front end or back end players were provided for and drills changed regularly so as to provide interest and variety for all participants. The added use of the west green for skills was good as the focus on this green was on draw bowling so it appealed to newer bowlers and front end players.

Since the final successful Try Bowls promotion, the coaching panel has been busy preparing new bowlers for winter social bowls.

Our accredited coaches are Andrei Butskikh, Jim Baker, Jim Cull, David Perry, Pat Russell, Gary Simmons and Geoff Bryant. The coaches are conscious of the fact that the group will be seen as novice coaches for the benefit of new and inexperienced bowlers however, there is bowling experience, bowling skill and a passion to help within the group. Members at all levels wanting some coaching or work on a specific skill are encouraged to catch up with coaches or contact Geoff Bryant to organise a mutually convenient time to work together or if convenient, at a recently introduced Tuesday afternoon, individual coaching sessions .

Tournament (Mal Walker. Chairperson)

The Tournament Committee has been an active group of five members who have coordinated a season of social bowls, tournaments and club championships. All committee members have shown great commitment to the betterment of our great club.

Gary Simmons must be congratulated on his commitment in running the annual Pro-shot Tournament. Likewise, Val Weight excelled in coordinating the annual Gala Day which returns good income to the Club.

The annual Mulgrave Country Club Challenge with 128 players filling both greens was another highlight. The major prizes on the night were taken out by our own teams but in the end, Mulgrave CC won the event by 21 shots.

Many great contests were witnessed throughout the Club Championships. Barbara Brown's commitment in assisting with the running of these games and the support given by markers made the events a valuable part of our bowling season.

FACILITIES REPORT

Andrew Ross and his greens team have provided members and visitors alike with greens well up to Pennant standard and a credit to those members that spend many hours each week preparing both greens.

Andrew's main goals again this year, were set at the start of the season;

- 1. To achieve a green speed of less than 17 seconds for all pennant games.
- 2. Obtain the highest possible rating for the annual Greens Inspection.
- 3. To provide members with the best possible playing surfaces.

These three goals were achieved with East Green awarded an "A" (Very Good) rating the highest level possible and our West green rated "B" (Good).

Important regular maintenance work included;

- Watering and regular grooming to reduce green speeds.
- Regular poisoning and spraying to remove algae from the surface of both greens
- Modification of greens usage to reduce wear on both greens at different times of the year.
- Painting lines on greens.
- Regular trimming of trees and shrubs to limit overshadowing.
- Cleaning ditches, banks and surrounds

Repairs to shelters and drinks fountains, removing rubbish and garden maintenance

Viv Bennett and her group of dedicated gardeners have presented both the gardens and surrounds in great shape and admired by both members and visitors, alike.

Our maintenance manager John Malloy has repaired/replaced and/or skilfully manufactured many of our assets and routinely proving that no job was too challenging or too much trouble

Finally, Stewart Andrew has our clubhouse and decking looking very smart regularly preparing jaded surfaces and applying a fresh coat of paint as needed.
