PRESIDENTS REPORT

I recently had the privilege of presenting *Meritorious Service Awards* to members who distinguished themselves through outstanding service to our Club. They were:

<u>Matt Petruccelli</u> has been a member for 35 years, served on Committees (including as Club VP), convened tennis, organized significant social events, raised plenty of money, was Club Liquor Licensee, initiated darts and continues as convener.

<u>Ross Borden</u> served industriously as Bar Manager, Selector, Bowls Committee, RVBA Delegate, Greens maintenance and Greens Director. Ross did many of these roles concurrently over a 15 year period.

<u>Flick Nolan</u> joined in 1980 and instantly became involved in tennis committees particularly with juniors, mid-week ladies and later at district level. Flick was active in organising social events and continues today as chairperson of the tennis section even though she is no longer a player.

<u>Nancy & Colin Evans</u> joined in 1994 as new bowls members and quickly got involved in Club affairs. Both have served on Committees, worked tirelessly on our gardens and have raised <u>considerable</u> funds for the Club through craft stalls, embroidering names on shirts and selling home-made jams & pickles.

We thank these members for their wonderful contributions to our Club over many years and congratulate them on their well-deserved awards, For various reasons including overseas travel, I regret that we have not been able to find a suitable occasion to physically present Nancy & Colin with their MSA plaque. We will make it happen sometime soon.

Prior to the election in November Kirstie Marshall announced that our grant application for replacement of the East Green was approved (with no strings attached). However, on 7th January we were informed that our application was <u>unsuccessful</u>. This saga is extremely disappointing to say the least. I feel disillusioned, let down and annoyed. Now our challenge is to find alternate ways to get this critical project funded/delivered in an acceptable timeframe.

The very wet winter and spring has been fantastic for our reservoirs and has boosted growth of lawns and gardens across the State. I'm sure you'll agree





that the Club's gardens have never looked better. However this rain has not been so good for our revenue. Rained out tennis and bowls events have been very costly particularly at a time when we are trying to grow our cash reserves to pay for upcoming major projects.

On a brighter note, we have gained excellent new revenue streams through the booking of corporate bowls days. We also ran a very successful bowls tournament early in January. These events give the Club extra exposure throughout the local community and the revenue has helped to make up (at least partially) for the thousands of dollars lost to rain. Nevertheless, we may still be forced to limit our near term spending.

We received many entries into our recent logo design competition. After careful deliberation, we have now made our selection which we think is attractive and appropriate for the Club going forward. We hope you like it too. The new design symbolically represents the three sports offered by our Club by emulating the flight path of a dart, the trajectory of a tennis ball and the bias of a bowl. This is set on a rectangular background that represents the shape of a tennis court and bowling rink.

In last year's Annual Report I mentioned the importance of volunteers. Indeed volunteers are critical for most Clubs. There are plenty of our members who put up their hand and work for the Club on an elected basis and others who help in a less formal way. Unfortunately there are many more that just sit back and rely on the good will and efforts of others. You know who are — we know too. It is time to change this situation. We need to share the load more evenly. Without the good work of volunteers our Club would not survive so, if not already involved, I encourage you to get aboard and participate in the running of the Club. **Take the initiative**, talk to a Committee person about your skills and interests and find out where we have vacancies. This equally applies to parents of juniors as they also have a role to play. With more people helping we will not burn out the willing workers. I know that you will get personal satisfaction from volunteering no matter whether on a regular or ad-hoc basis. Try it!

On February 4th and 11th we are opening our Club to the general community with the clear aim of promoting the whole Club and recruiting new members.
