PRESIDENTS REPORT

I wish to start by thanking all those that have assisted in the running of the club over the past twelve months.

The Club is in a very good position with a small increase in overall membership and is in a sound financial position, but this does not mean we can become complacent. We have a \$150,000 dollar commitment to the renovation of the building, unknown fit out costs that are not part of the renovation and will continue to incur expenses in maintaining the greens and courts along with club running costs.

"We have a major renovation occurring to the bottom club room which will greatly enhance the comfort of members and allow greater community engagement. The Bowls, Darts and Tennis sections have plans to develop and grow their sections.

We are currently upgrading the VSC website to make it more relevant and user friendly.

As with most sporting and community clubs, this club is run by volunteers, we cannot continue to depend on the few, we need the many. Please consider joining or assisting the section committees, volunteering to help on the green or on the court, in the kitchens, to assist with the club maintenance or on work parties, social activities and fund raising, indeed joining the VSC committee. Any and all assistance helps.

TENNIS CLUB

The Tennis section continues to supply an excellent facility for the Tennis members and the large numbers of Juniors from the community to be outside, playing sport and interacting with each other.

DARTS - Our Dart numbers have increased and are at capacity with the existing

number of boards available – provision for an extra dart board position has been included in the renovation of the building. Whilst there is some disruption during the renovation, I feel confident that Neil Ramage and darts players will continue to go about their business with little to no fuss. We hope they continue to enjoy their involvement with the club well into the future.

BUILDING – The renovations are progressing according to the schedule with completion due in February 2024. Based on the projected expenditure the total cost of the project will be \$2,900,000 (excluding GST). Within this budget there may be an opportunity to make minor improvements in the kitchen, but this is not confirmed.

The stairs between the greens are complete but the ramp is not expected to be built until December 2023.

As the development progresses we will need to make adjustments to how we use the West Green.

SPONSORSHIP – The VSC established a sponsorship sub-committee in 2022 under the leadership of Spiro Agius.

The sub-committee undertook a complete audit of all past and current sponsors. In doing so the sub-committee reconnected with all lapsed and recent sponsors as well as seeking to attract new sponsors.

There has been \$22,470 raised to date for 23/24 year with a further \$4k plus expected.

Rhyman have not renewed this year as this area has no appeal for marketing at the moment. Next year may see a development in Ringwood so there may be an opportunity to renew some form of sponsorship.

A number of sponsors are providing "goods in kind" the total value of which stands over \$2000.

The sponsorship sub-committee continues to strengthen relationships with all existing sponsors and will continue to seek out further potential sponsors.

I would like to thank the committee members for their hard work in achieving the results that they have.

Finally, in closing, I wish to express my gratitude to the VSC committee for their work and assistance over the previous term and to all the members of the club who continue to make this club the great glub that it is.

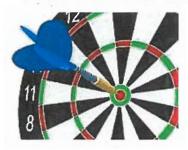

- Our social program has run throughout the year and maintained good numbers playing. We

 very successful and good for the club and its reputation. We also had our annual Mulgrave

 floodlights on only one green, our seasons are limited to daylight savings times of the year.

This year has been a challenge following our temporary move to the upper club house, with limited space leading to much jostling, & near misses from the odd errant dart. However, good natured & competitive dart games are played, nonetheless.

Thanks go to all players who arrive early to set up the room which requires a lot of furniture moving, oche placements & distribution of scoring materials. Also, thanks to those who stay late & reverse the process.

Many thanks also to our retiring scribe, **Darren**, who has provided the interesting & amusing weekly darts articles for the VSC newsletter, since 2020, to early this year. **Adrian** has since taken up the challenge, continuing the great work, providing articles that all darts players look forward to reading each week.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the volunteers who have donated their time and expertise to help around the club. We've had some really productive working bees (and there's more to come) which have neatened up the club grounds. We are always on the lookout for more volunteers. If you can help out the club we would really like to hear from you.

I'd like to express my thanks to the tennis committee and competition convenors. In no particular order I would like to thank Libby Fergusson, Jess O'Meara, Sean Wilkeson, Mark Judd, Mayumi Takahashi-Chan, and James Byrne. You have helped so much to ensure the competitions run smoothly, and keeping things in order.

I'm really proud of all of the players who compete for Vermont South Club. I'm am also really grateful for everyone who competes or plays socially with other club members. This will ensure we continue to maintain great courts, as well as saving costs through using less water, and being able to use rainwater. This will be our next big project after the renovations of the club

As always our focus is to make sure that Vermont South Club is a place where members and visitors enjoy spending time at. We're a community club and we want to really make sure we're fostering a welcoming and warm environment. Be on the lookout for more social events!

I will be stepping down as Tennis Chairperson effective from the end of the AGM. I've been in the position for 5 years and we've had an interesting time. TREASURER'S REPORT



TREASURER'S REPORT

The 2022/2023 year has seen further improvement in our financial situation. We recorded a profit of \$33,713 compared with the previous year's profit of \$15,001; an increase of \$18,712.

Last year's profit included an \$18,000 grant for tennis court lighting, so our normal operating result improved by \$36,712. An excellent result.

Income for the year is up \$51,819. It has increased in most areas, in particular: □ Sponsorship is up \$31,315. □ Bowls Playing Fees are up \$20,514. □ Net Result of the Bar is up \$5,697.
Grant income is down \$21,136 and Membership income has declined marginally (down \$674) due to changes in membership categories.
Expenses for the year are up \$33,107. Most expenses are up on last year with the increased activity around the club and the increasing cost of goods and services. Our total Cash is now \$367,988, up \$46,005 since last year. We have \$327,884 set aside in Term Deposits for our share of the Bowls Clubhouse renovation and the next Bowling Green replacement.
Once again, we are reporting an encouraging result, and once again there is still a lot of work to be done to manage significant financial challenges we will have over the coming years.

Whilst we currently have enough cash to cover the cost of the renovation, we will

Whilst we currently have enough cash to cover the cost of the renovation, we will need to continue saving \$30K to \$40K per year so we can afford to replace the East Bowling Green surface when it is required. This will not just be a green replacement because drainage work will be needed also. I expect we will need at least \$250,000 for this.

Once again, I would like to thank the various VSC committees and members generally, for their help and support over the past 12 months. If we keep working together, I am sure our club will remain successful and continue to grow.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of Preparation.

The committee has determined that Vermont South Club Inc. is not a reporting entity and accordingly, this financial statement is a special purpose financial statement prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act (VIC). The committee has determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, except for certain assets, which, as noted, have been written down to fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the prior year.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

1.2 Inventories

Inventories are recorded at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Cost is based on first-in first-out cost method and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the stock and bringing them to the existing condition and location. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of the normal selling pattern.

1.3 Property, Plant & Equipment

Items of property, plant and equipment including buildings and other leasehold property are recorded at cost less depreciation. As there is no expectation that existing leases with the Whitehorse Council will not be renewed, depreciation is applied on a straight line basis over the estimated useful life of the assets.

1.4 Depreciation

Depreciation charge is a charge against the Net Income of the Club. Estimates of remaining useful lives are made on a regular basis for all assets, with annual reassessments for major items. The Statement of Financial Performance for the Year Ended 30 June 2023 reflects the normal accounting treatment.

1.5 Goods & Services Tax

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

NOTE 3: Bendigo Bank Loan Account

The loan from the Bendigo Bank is secured by a guarantee for advances given by the Whitehorse City Council in favour of the Bendigo Bank, to cover borrowing by the club for the development of the Club House and the new green for a term of 20 years. The Club has not provided any security to the Council for its provision of the guarantee, other than that covered by the lease from the Council to the Club for all of the Club's improvements at Charlesworth Park.

Scope
